



- 1. *Learning Corner:* At 6:30 p.m. David Poteet presented the recent split of Canada Goose and Cackling Goose. He also discussed the small sandpipers Semipalmated, Western, Least.
- 2. *Business meeting* was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Kathy Farr.
- 3. *Bird sightings* included nesting Yellow-crowned Night Herons, the hybrid Gray-crowned Yellowthroat at Sabal Palms, Great White Heron and Greater Flamingo at the Texas City Dike, Red-headed Woodpeckers, Sprague's Pipit on Bolivar, and Aplomado Falcons near Brownsville.

- 5. *GCBO Xtreme Hummingbird Xtravaganza* is Sept. 11 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. in Lake Jackson. Skip Almoney asked for volunteers to staff the OG booth and to help at the food concession.

- 6. *Library* Committee Recommendation (see August *Spoonbill*) was unanimously accepted after presentation by Margret Simmons for the committee. The non-circulating collection will be placed at Bear Creek Park with the Master Naturalist Program.
- 7. *Membership* chair Pat Pease is requesting volunteers to help with monthly meeting registration.
- 8. Library: Andy Scott will have the recent contributions available at the next meeting.
- 9. *Spoonbill* editor Al Shultz is seeking contributions from all members, including short birding anecdotes. Deadline for next issue is August 10.
- 10. Environmental Issues: Mary Dodson has copies available of Jim Blackburn's letter relating to water issues.
- 11. *Field Trip* Coordinator Bill Saulmon announced great birds on the May and last quarterly field trips. Bachman's Sparrow and multiple Swallow-tailed Kites were seen on the Big Thicket trip and a Mourning Warbler was seen on the Sheldon Lake field trip. Winnie Burkett will lead the August 21 trip to Bolivar, meeting at 7:30am at Bolivar side of ferry. The September 18 trip will be to Smith Point Hawk Watch. The next quarterly weekend trip will be October 30 31 to Corpus Christi and the King Ranch.
- 12. *Michael Williams*, Vice-Chairman, was congratulated and thanked by Kathy Farr for the wonderful programs he has planned for the coming year. Next month the program will be a joint meeting with Houston Audubon Society at the zoo. March 2005 will also be a joint meeting with HAS with Kevin Karlson as the speaker and subsequent field trip leader.
- 13. *Program:* "Raptors at Smith Point" was presented by Sumita Prasad who facilitates research for the Gulf Coast Bird Observatory. The hawk watch tracks trends in abundance and distribution of migratory diurnal raptors. Non-migratory raptors are counted in their post-breeding dispersion. The Smith Point Hawk Watch is sponsored in part by GCBO, Hawk Watch International, and Texas Parks and Wildlife Dept. Since 1991, twenty-four species have been documented with 55,015 being the average number of birds per season. Raptors seen include Northern Harrier, Osprey, kites, accipiters, buteos, eagles, Crested Caracara, and falcons. Neotropical migrants are seen in the nearby oak mottes and Magnificent Frigatebirds are seen overhead. September 25 & 26 workshops led by Bill Clark and others will be held at Smith Point.

### Saturday, September 18, 2004: Field Trip to the Smith Point Hawk Watch –

Join us for a true spectacle of nature as thousands of migrating raptors stream over the Smith Point Hawk Watch platform. Water birds including Magnificent Frigatebirds can also be seen from the platform. We'll also bird the nearby oak mottes for passerine migrants and visit Robbins Park for shorebirds. Meet hawk watch counter Bill Saulmon at 8:30 AM at the Smith Point Hawk Watch platform. To get there from Houston, travel east on I-10 to exit 813. Turn south on Highway 61 for a few miles to the 4-way stop. Proceed straight ahead through the stop where the road becomes FM 562. Follow FM 562 to a fork (Y) in the road and stay on FM 562, which veers to the right at the Y. After approximately 14 miles you will arrive in the small village of Smith Point. Continue straight ahead towards the bay and just before the road dead-ends into the bay take the gravel road on the left (look for the Hawk Watch sign). Allow about 90 minutes to drive from Houston. Bring water, sun lotion, bug spray, hat, and your binoculars/scopes. You can bring a lunch if you want to continue birding in the afternoon.

#### Saturday, October 16, 2004: Field Trip to W.G. Jones State Forest –

The Texas State Forest Service operates this 1700 acre demonstration forest just north of the Woodlands. The forest is known for its endangered Red-cockaded Woodpeckers (RCW), and Brownheaded Nuthatches. The forest checklist also includes 8 species of woodpeckers. Our guide will be District Forester John Warner who will meet us at the forest office at 8:00 AM and tell us about the history and status of Jones State Forest. Since the RCW is best seen at dawn coming out of its nest, those who are interested can meet Bill Saulmon at the forest office at 6:45 and we'll go to an active RCW nest site and then return to the office at 8:00. To get there travel north from Houston on I-45 to FM 1488, then go west on FM 1488 about a mile to the forest office on your right. You can bring a lunch if you want to continue birding in the area with Bill during the afternoon.

Saturday & Sunday, October 30 & 31: Field Trip to Corpus Christi & King Ranch – Drive on your own or carpool to Corpus Christi (the birdiest city in the U.S.) where we will spend Friday (10/29) and Saturday (10/30) nights at a local motel. We'll take a guided birding tour of the King Ranch on Saturday morning and bird some of the other area hot spots the remainder of Saturday & Sunday. We'll finish up on Sunday afternoon in time to let folks drive back to Houston before dark. Trip attendance will be limited due to King Ranch tour van restrictions. The King Ranch tour fee will be about \$25 and will require advance payment to hold reservations. Contact Bill Saulmon as soon as possible for more information and to sign up for the trip.

# Chairman's Message

It's time to bring up a topic that most groups prefer to avoid. . . money. OG needs more to continue our tradition of excellent programs. Last year we voted to pay a \$100 honorarium to increase our ability to attract high quality speakers.

This has been a great first step. However, we also need to upgrade our presentation abilities with a new PowerPoint-capable projector. Laptop computers and digital photography used in today's presentations require this new technology. If we want to continue to attract quality programs we need (...continued, p. 4)

to spend between \$1000 and \$1500 to upgrade. This is a big chunk of change for us. How do we pay for it? It has been suggested that we use part of the \$3500 or so in our savings account, which may be a good idea.

However, this won't help increase our annual income, which is necessary for paying monthly honorariums and, once or twice a year, paying expenses for "Big Birding Names," such as Kevin Karlson (our joint March program with HAS). His expenses will be about \$800. We are splitting this with Houston Audubon. Our part is \$400, of which we need an additional \$200. Where does this come from? We also have June Osborne of Wild Bird Magazine coming in January, 2005, with expenses of \$150, which is \$50 more than the honorarium.

There are many ways to raise money. All of them require our membership's commitment to achieve success. How committed are you? Will you volunteer time and money to participate in a membership drive? Would you join a team in a birding competition, getting pledges for your number of species? Are you willing to put up an additional \$50 a year for a speaker's fund? Maybe there are fresher ideas roaming about for raising the money we need. Whatever we choose, it needs to be something that can be an annual event. One idea that comes to mind is having a bird naming contest, with pledges attached. It could be silly names, mind-boggling names, or even "what they should be" names.

Whatever we decide to do, raising money and increasing membership are necessary for our continued good health as a group of folks who love birding. It's time to get involved with the green stuff so we can keep ourselves in the feathers. What are you willing to do to help?

# Thirty Years Ago:

MERCER PARK ARBORETUM (1974)

This newest Harris County Park was opened just this spring:, having been acquired from Mr. & Mrs. Charles Mercer, who desired that their 14½ acre homesite be maintained as an arboretum and enjoyed by the public. It is open from 9 to 6 Monday through Friday, and 2 to 6 on Sunday. Volunteers are in attendance on Sundays to show people around and answer questions about the plants, shrubs, and flowers.
